

The obvious advantages of a Table Model Television Receiver are first that it takes up less room than a floor model and next, but quite important, that it should cost less. But if the small size and the lower price are obtained by cutting the specification then your Table Model may not prove so good after all. When you're buying sound only, as in an ordinary radio set, you may be able to put up with a poor reproduction. Indeed lots of people do. They say 'it sounds all right to them', even though trained ears may think it horrible. But you can't cheat your eyes as easily as your ears. Distortion of sound may be bearable-even likeable to some ears. Who said crooning? But if the picture on your Television Screen is distorted, if it waggles about or "melts" then no living soul is going to find that pleasant or enjoyable to watch.

So we come to our first Table Television Set, the VII4. It is small because we have made use of what we learned during the war about miniature valves and other components. But the picture (71 × 6") is sharp, steady and bright. In short we have saved the space and lowered the cost without endangering either sound or vision.



The V114 is a receiver for Television sound and vision only. Very good pictures can be obtained up to about 50 miles-in tests quite passable pictures have been received at 80 miles from the transmitter but this would only be in specially favourable spots. The black and white picture is 74" wide by 6" deep and sharp and photographic in quality. A special noise suppressor is included to eliminate interference from car ignition. The top and front of the cabinet is of rosewood and the lower part, veneered in mahogany and currying speaker and controls, is set back. Apart from giving emphasis where it is wanted, to the screen, the design makes servicing of the receiver exceptionally easy. The speaker bars are splayed outwards from the centre, partly concealing a plain gold rayon fabric.
