



Little Image Blows Up Big. Projected television pictures can be brought to life on a screen in sizes from a few inches up to 4' by 6' and larger depending upon audience requirements. Lens adjustments similar to those on a film projector regulate picture size. Two of the new projection sets are pictured here. RCA's set, right, employs a Schmidt-type reflective system, while the receiver made by Cortley Television Corp., New York, uses a refractive lens. The inset shows the received image covering a small portion of the Cortley's 5" tube face. Both systems are adjustable for front or rear projection.
