## COLOR TV SERIES TO SHOW SURGERY

## Program Will Be a Feature of State Medical Society's **Par**ley Opening Today

A television program in color covering surgical procedures and a variety of clinical subjects will be a feature of the 146th annual fiveday convention of the Medical Society of the State of New York, opening tomorrow in the Statler Hotel.

The series of telecasts from Bellevue Hospital will be presented with the cooperation of the New York University College of Medicine and Post Graduate Medical School. It has been arranged by the Smith, Kline & French Laboratories.

The program is expected to mark an important extension of the society's use of the teaching possibilities of closed circuit television. Such procedures as biopsy of the liver, plastic surgery, relationship of the patient to the psychiatrist and a clinic on congenital heart disease will be televised.

Leading physicians and bacteriologists will deliver papers on the general practice of medicine as well as on specialized subjects. The Women's Auxiliary to the society will hold concurrent meetings, with a program centered on nursing, medical defense and legislation. It will hold a reception tomorrow for out-of-town members.
