### *Radio-TV Notes*

Richard Lewine has been appointed an executive producer by C. B. S. television with his first assignment to be the preparation of a color program series. Jerry Danzig, formerly supervisor of color programs, has been assigned to prepare a one-hour dramatic program to be televised in black-and-white. No starting date has been set for the latter series.

It is understood that C. B. S. is working on a color series that would be presented Mondays through Fridays from 5:30 to 6 P. M. over Channel 2. Pending approval of commercial color by the Federal Communications Commission, the series would be televised on an experimental basis.

Guy Lombardo and his orchestra will be heard from the Roosevelt Hotel Grill in a new weekly program to be presented over Channel 4 beginning Friday from 7 to 7:30 P. M. The program will be sponsored by Lincoln-Mercury dealers in the metropolitan area.
