

DELAY IN COLOR TV SIFTED

House Committee Will Start Hearings After Easter

WASHINGTON, March 13 (AP)—An investigation of what is keeping color television off the market was announced today by Representative Charles A. Wolverton, chairman of the House Commerce Committee.

"The public is aware that a license has been granted and yet there is no color television for the homes," he declared.

He said that hearings would probably start after the Easter recess of Congress.

Senator Charles W. Tobey, chairman of the Senate Commerce Committee, has indicated that its staff would be asked to make a similar inquiry.

Paul A. Walker, chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, told the House committee today that the radio and television industry should be investigated by Congress or the commission to determine whether Congress should vote to the commission authority to regulate network practices.
