

My dear Mr. Hart:

This has reference to our telephone conversation of today's date in connection with the education and practical experience qualifications of Mr. Paul W. Steen whom you desire to appoint as director of the American Radio Institute in Buffalo.

I have examined Mr. Steen's Personal Data Form. Evidence is on file that he is a high school graduate and has earned ten points credit as a student in New York University. His Army Separation Qualification Record indicates that he had forty months practical experience as a radio mechanic while in the Army. Evidence is also on file that he was employed as a radio service man in private industry for approximately nine and one-half months. His five years experience as a teacher of radio and television service and repair may be accepted in lieu of the remaining practical experience.

His temporary appointment as director will be approved upon receipt of an application card and fee for his director's temporary permit.
