

Demonstrator Shows TV IIIs. A complete, working television receiver flattened out on a 3½' by 5½' panel is expected to help servicemen identify and cure many set troubles. The demonstrator above, built by John Meagher, of RCA, is now touring the country. It is used in conjunction with

a slide-illustrated lecture to show the effect of various parts changes on the received picture. The circuit is broken down into 10 main "block" components, and each element is diagramed on the panel. Plug-in connections are used on most parts so they can be removed or replaced for demonstration.
